Course Content/Syllabus

- Build on the knowledge, understanding and skills for AS.
- Integrate, where appropriate, the skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing in the development of linguistic competence.
- Continue to provide a coherent satisfying and worthwhile course of study for students who do not progress to further study in the subject.
- There are 2 units which draw upon 7 general topic areas:
Youth culture & Concerns
Lifestyle: Health & Fitness
The World Around us
Education & Employment
Customs, traditions, beliefs and religions
National & International events
Literature and the Arts

Unit 3 – Understanding & Spoken Response in Spanish –

Students will outline their chosen issue for a minute, adopting a definite stance. They will defend and justify their opinions for up to 4 minutes, followed by a spontaneous discussion in which a minimum of 2 further areas of discussion will be covered.

- **Unit 4 – Researching, Understanding & Written Response in Spanish -**
 Students will undertake a short written translation exercise from English into Spanish. They will also write a Spanish language essay in response to a choice of 7 questions from the general topic areas. This essay may be discursive or creative.
 There will be a research-based essay in Spanish, linked to an area of interest to the student, relating to the culture/society of a Spanish speaking country and related to the 4 research-based essay topic areas for this unit.
