Course Content/Syllabus

This course will include the topic areas used at Breakthrough Stage, but with a greater range of language used in terms of:-

- Taking part in social situations
- Seeking clarification
- Giving information
- Asking and answering questions
- Describing / talking about the present / past / future
- Asking for /giving opinions & instructions
- Using numbers and time
- Agreeing /disagreeing & comparing
- Expressing preferences/ feelings / emotions

After completing, students should be able to accomplish the 4 elements of listening, speaking, reading and writing with the possibility of undertaking mid-year Asset assessment.

- Understand, use and adapt learned language relating to a range of predictable, everyday matters.
- Maintain a simple conversation and recognise the differences between past, present and future events and be familiar with simple forms of the verb tenses.

Assessment Methods

Continuous assessments based on 'Can Do' statements. End of year tests on the four skills of speaking, listening, reading and writing
