### Entry Requirements

All applicants must have a level 3 qualification in English or the equivalent. All applicants should have a full level 5 qualification and/or equivalent allowing them to teach in the Lifelong Learning sector. Applicants will either be already teaching or wish to specialise in teaching ESOL or Literacy. All should have access to a minimum of 75 teaching practice hours in ESOL or Literacy (either with/without a formal contract).
