### Course Content/Syllabus

This course will include the following topics:

- Use conversational techniques giving general and detailed information
- Ask for, give, justify and respond to opinions
- Agree, disagree and evaluate options
- Compare, contrast and adapt information
- Express and respond to attitudes, emotions and suggestions
- Talk in past, present and future
- Express intention, certainty and doubt
- Talk about (im)probability and (im)possibility and hypothesis

**After completing, students will be able to choose which elements of reading, speaking, listening and writing they wish to be assessed in either at Intermediate or Advanced Stage depending on their prior experience. By the end of the course, you should be able to:**

- Use a range of tenses and registers; be able to communicate confidently and maintain a conversation and write using a wide ranging vocabulary and complex structures. Your pronunciation, intonation and spelling will generally be accurate. You should be able to make references to the culture and society of the country. You should be able to understand what you hear and the majority of what you read.

### Assessment Methods

Continuous assessments based on 'Can Do' statements with mid-course or end of year tests on some or all of the four skills of speaking, listening, reading and writing
